# Chaplaincy

## Who are the Chaplains?

Chaplains are members of hospital staff, trained to provide spiritual, religious and pastoral care. They are from most of the major faith and belief communities available to support patients, their visitors and staff. The chaplains are supported in their work by trained volunteers from a variety of religious and belief backgrounds.

All hospital staff, including chaplains and chaplaincy volunteers, are bound by strict rules of confidentiality.

The companionship and support offered by the Chaplaincy Team is not limited to people who are religious. We understand that there are times when we all need a compassionate, friendly, listening ear, and we are often called upon to support people during their time in hospital whether they have a religious faith or not.

Chaplains visit wards regularly and can be called to visit individuals at any time. An emergency on-call chaplaincy service is always available. In such circumstances, they should be contacted via the hospital switchboard on 0121 627 2000.
