Staff are reminded that it is an expectation from the Trust for them to carry out asymptomatic testing twice a week, either by lateral flow or LAMP test.

Isolate at home for five days as per current guidance.

Take a lateral flow test on days five and six, at least 24 hours apart. If you test negative on both of those days you can return to work on day six.

Daily lateral flow tests should be taken on day seven, eight, nine and 10, and then twice weekly testing can begin again.

If you are still testing positive on lateral flow after six days you should continue to isolate.

If you are still testing positive after day 10, you may return to work if your manager is able to accommodate you. If after 14 days you are still testing positive you can stop carrying out daily lateral flow tests and return to work.
