Main duties of the placement	 Care of predominantly gastroenterology and also general medical patients on GI ward; eg ward rounds; ensuring up to date handover sheet; requesting bloods, investigations, imaging, discharge paperwork and ensuring follow-up; clerking new admissions Management of acutely unwell patients on the ward On call cover for acute medicine Prepare and present at weekly MDT inflammatory bowel disease meeting between GI and colorectal team
